

COMM 201 Principles of Communication Sample Course Outline Panama Program

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Communication 201 provides an overview of the study of communication. Its main aim is to give students a comprehensive introduction to the various sub-fields in the communication discipline. The topics included in this course range from verbal and nonverbal messages to the use of text-messaging to convey meaning. Many communication concepts are introduced as a means of helping the student understand how to study communication.

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES

Upon completing this course, students will be able to:

- Communicate an understanding of how knowledge about communication is established and how and why it changes over time; (essays, quizzes, final exam)
- Evaluate evidence and apply it to solving problems through communication research methods; (essays)
- Communicate an understanding of a body of knowledge from a communication disciplinary perspective; (*quizzes, final exam, exercises*)
- Recognize the contribution of the field of communication to the social sciences; (quizzes, final exam, exercises)
- Identify a variety of communication styles that are sensitive to the needs and interest of diverse groups of people; (quizzes, exercises)
- Develop strategies for thinking about and engaging in communication based upon innovative theories and perspectives; (essays, exercises)
